2. Treasurer's Update:
  - a. Nothing new to report
3. Business
  - a. A new chair and webmaster will need to be selected, as Liz Workman has been accepted to the bioinformatics graduate program at the University of Utah. Valeri Craigle will redesign the UALC website, Alan Groesbeck will assume the position of webmaster.
  - b. Nominees for chair-elect will be circulated to the listserv for a vote.
4. Review of UHSLC Goals and Objectives
  - a. UHSLC Digitization project: to collect and digitize UHSLC materials, give them some historical context, and make the collection available on the Web.
    - i. We will wait for the next CONTENTdm upgrade to begin uploading documents. The upgrade will allow us to upload full-text indexed PDFs in one step instead of two.
    - ii. Valeri will create the web interface. Jeanne will find out who Valeri needs to be in contact with at the Eccles Library to implement the necessary customizations.
    - iii. A metadata template has been created so that members can provide their own descriptive information for individual items. A metadata training session will be held for UHSLC/Eccles.
  - b. Reference Continuity Service
    - i. John Bramble is looking for one representative from each state in the midcontinental region. Volunteers are asked to participate in one meeting per month to discuss any issues with the service. The reps will then report back to their libraries. It was proposed that Mike Nielson be the rep for Utah.
  - c. MCMLA 2007 Poster Abstract
    - i. The conference theme for 2007 is "License to Learn/License to Lead". Jeanne Le Ber submitted an abstract titled *Utah Health Sciences Library Consortium Constructs a Digital Collection*. Authors include Valeri Craigle, Jeanne Le Ber, Allyson Mower, Joan Stoddart, and Lynn Wilson.

    - i. Several ideas were proposed at the last meeting for creating a campaign to encourage high school students/undergraduate students to pursue careers as health sciences librarians. Some ideas we have already explored include:
