Abstract:

The University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health's Innovations in Medical Education Team has launched a new Digital Video Library. This resource represents a collaboration between health science educators, information technology staff and academic librarians. The Digital Video Library consists of educational presentations that are captured at the Health Sciences Learning Center and made available to students, faculty, community preceptors, public health organizations, and health consumers. By forging new partnerships between different groups involved in providing information resources, the video presentations have been enhanced by expert cataloging, links and research assistance as well as interactive functions, such as RSS feeds and discussion forums. This demonstration will highlight features that were developed in partnership and showcase the benefits to early and diverse collaborations.
